Dear neighbors –

Please join us on Tuesday, April 4 at 7:30 PM at the historic Palisades Rec Center for our next general meeting. Our special guest will be at-large DC Councilmember Elissa Silverman. She will update us on important issues and there will be time for questions from the public. Councilmember Silverman has visited us before and she is always an informative and thought-provoking speaker.

We will also be seeing the first public showing of the plans for the new Rec Center building. Interior work is slated to begin in June, and after our annual 4th of July parade and celebration the exterior work will start.

In early March, Mayor Bowser introduced a bill to lease the old Hardy School on Foxhall Road to a private school for fifty years. The disposition of this property is an issue of interest to many people in our community. As I write this, no community meetings or hearings have been announced, but we will continue to follow the issue and keep the community up to date.

April 30 is the deadline to apply for a Palisades Community Fund grant. The PCF is the grant-making arm of the PCA and supports projects benefiting the Palisades community that promote charitable activities, cultural enrichment, community education and service, economic improvements and environmental enhancements. DC Fair Skies Coalition

Members of the Fair Skies Coalition updated the PCA at its last general membership meeting March 7. For those who were not able to attend, here are some important takeaways.



The coalition is not simply looking at the routing of planes arriving and departing from Reagan National. Routing is only one of the factors which contributes to aircraft noise. In addition the coalition is looking at possibly restricting departure and arrival times and limiting the size and models of aircraft permitted to utilize the airport. As was pointed out Dulles International



Airport was supposed to be the principal airport for the DC region; clearly more traffic could be shifted there.

In addition, it was noted that a Palisades resident has successfully appealed their property tax assessment based on the increased aircraft noise in our neighborhood beginning in 2015 as a result of the flight pattern change. The more residents who are willing to appeal tax assessments based on this precedent, the more city leaders will take the aircraft noise pollution issue in our neighborhood seriously.

THE PCF CALLS FOR PROPOSALS

The Palisades Community Fund (PCF) is currently calling for grant proposals to review at its spring meeting. Proposals must be postmarked or submitted electronically by April 30, 2017.

The PCF finances projects that promote charitable activities, cultural enrichment, community education and service, economic improvements and environmental enhancements in the Palisades neighborhood.

Grants by the Fund have supported a variety of local projects for schools, the Palisades Branch library, beautification of MacArthur Boulevard, the Hardy and Palisades Rec Centers, the local fire station, as well as the Palisades Farmer's Market and Palisades Village.

Grants have also been awarded to support projects initiated by individuals including the Palisades Weather Station and a memorial bench in honor of Ida Marien.

RESOLUTION

Approved by the Palisades Citizens Association
March 7, 2017

The Palisades Citizens Association (PCA) takes note of the following:

- ▶ The District of Columbia Department of Transportation has begun replacing conventional street lights with energy-efficient LED lights.
- ▶ DDOT plans to issue a Request for Proposal to replace all of the District's 71,000 street lights with LED lights.
- ▶ The LED street lights being installed by DDOT emit a large amount of blue-wavelength light and thus appear a harsh, blue-white color (4000 Kelvin).
- ▶ The American Medical Association has warned that blue-rich LED lights produce more glare than conventional lighting, creating a road hazard.
- ▶ The AMA has warned that blue-rich LED lights are potentially harmful to human health because of their impact on circadian sleep cycles.

▶ The AMA recommends that outdoor lighting use "the lowest emission of blue light possible." This can be achieved with warm-white LED lights that are 3000 Kelvin or less.

RESOLVED:

The Palisades Citizens Association supports adoption of energy-efficient LED street lighting in the District of Columbia while using the best available technology that is least likely to harm the health of District residents.

FURTHER RESOLVED:

The PCA recommends that the D.C. Department of Transportation adopt warm-white 2700 Kelvin LED lights for all street light installations in the District.


FURTHER RESOLVED:

The PCA recommends that DDOT replace all existing LED street lights in the District with warm-white 2700 Kelvin LED lights.

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
